Making a Title VI Complaint

Any person who believes he or she has been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI may file a complaint with Ride Connection. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with Ride Connection within 180 days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.
