MOBILITY

It comes in all shapes and sizes.

Ride Connection is customer-focused because we understand that each person has a unique level of mobility. In order to maintain a culture where the people we serve come first, we create programs that cater to a range of individual needs as well as the overall needs of our communities.



Over 230 individuals successfully exited the RideWise travel training program and went on to become independent travelers on public transportation and together went on to take over 55,000 trips on transit.

Community RideAbout Shuttles

There are seven community shuttles in operation in the tri-county area. Each shuttle is designed based on local geography, housing density and the population of communities served. These shuttles are highly efficient and provide an average of 3.45 trips per hour.

A Focus on Customer Service

Two Travel Coaches were added to our service center and have enhanced our level of customer service. Armed with a new data management system and updated assessment tool, our Travel Coaches explore all available transportation options based on needs, ability level, and proximity to transit, as well as customer wishes and transportation goals.

Over **410,000** rides were provided this year by Ride Connection and its partners. Our vehicles (including volunteers driving their own vehicles) traveled over **1.8 million miles**.

High Volume

Our service center staff fielded over 129,000 calls this year, an increase of 12% from last year.

COORDINATION

Makes the wheels go round.

Our partners are crucial to providing service in a calculated, coordinated manner and allow us all to serve more people with fewer resources. At Ride Connection we see it as our responsibility to foster relationships with organizations in our community and work together to do the most good. We provide varying levels of support to our partners who provide service, recognizing that true coordination is an effective and necessary component of leadership.

Ride Connection referred 58 new volunteer drivers to its service partners this year.

Technology Investments

GPS-equipped tablets were placed in 26 fleet vehicles. Their functionality includes the ability to view vehicle locations and provides us with real-time info which allows us to make quick adjustments to the schedule as needed.

Ride Connection implemented a new online learning management system, allowing our drivers and our partner's drivers to take required trainings online.

VOLUNTEERS

Are at the heart of our organization.

Riders' Clubs

Volunteer Ride Ambassadors lead trips on transit so older adults may have the experience of using public transportation with peers in a relaxed and enjoyable setting. Last year there were 751 participants and they went so many places: city tours, concerts, the zoo, art galleries, and libraries (to name a few).

Volunteers contribute to our mission in so many capacities. We benefit from volunteer drivers and concierges as well as office and administrative volunteers and Ride Ambassadors, who volunteer to lead group trips on transit. They make it possible to offer high quality service at no cost to our customers. Of the 642 drivers in our network, 429 are volunteers.

Volunteers contributed a total of 61,592 hours this year. While we consider them priceless, if you were to place a value on those hours, it would amount to an impressive \$1,093,461.

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Ride Together

We created a program based entirely on volunteers: customers can ask friends, neighbors, or family members for rides and Ride Connection provides support in the form of driver training and mileage reimbursement. The program gained traction this year, with 1,874 rides provided.

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
