From her work in combating racial and sexual discrimination, to being an indomitable advocate for the LGBTQIA+ community, RuthAnn was a powerhouse of generosity and inclusion. RuthAnn wished for her estate to serve the community. Upon her passing, her sister, Nileh, researched organizations that aligned with RuthAnn's lifelong work in community advocacy. She remembered that her sister has used Ride Connection's services in the past and reached out to our staff to discuss how we could possibly honor her sister. This resulted in the largest private individual donation in Ride Connection's history.

RuthAnn's spirit of giving has enabled us to create a new program in her memory, Ruth's Rides. This program was created in alignment with RuthAnn's vision to provide customers in need of bariatric

transportation to and from their medical appointments and treatments. We have already been able to provide over 90 rides since its inception with many more on the horizon thanks to the largest bequest from an individual in Ride Connection's history!

RuthAnn's lifelong advocacy and kindness will leave a lasting impact on our shared community. We are deeply grateful for her heart for advocacy and inclusion and are honored to carry out her legacy.

OREGON CHINESE COALITION AND RIDE CONNECTION JOIN FORCES TO OFFER RECREATIONAL TRIPS FOR SENIORS









Ride Connection is proud to partner with the Oregon Chinese Coalition to provide a free shuttle service for their monthly Take Seniors to the Garden trips.

For the initial trip on March, 10 seniors from a local retirement community were able to tour Lan Su Chinese Garden and enjoy the tea and desserts in the Yun Shui Teahouse. The program provides opportunities for seniors to get outside, socialize, and enjoy new experiences. This can be especially important for those who have been isolated due to COVID. For some participants, this was the first trip outside of their apartment in years.

Although it was a bit of a wet day, the moisture in the air accentuated the flower fragrance inside the garden and couldn't dampen the smiles shared throughout the visit as everyone took in the sights, snapped photos, and shared in conversation and laughter.

to continuing these outings to the garden
and taking groups to additional recreation
destinations in the future.


CUSTOMER STORY

RENEE

Renee was born in Portland but had moved away, returning in June of 2019 to work with Oregon Commission for the Blind (OCB). She had heard that Portland was a great city for mobility and public transportation.

Renee joined a dragon boat team to participate in the 2022 Portland Rose Festival on team Lethally Blind. When she first started paddling, another volunteer at Portland Adventist Community Services, where she volunteers as a receptionist 20 hours a week, and a sighted staff member at OCB were driving her to practice. However, Renee had practice three days a week and it was important to her to be able to get there independently. Ride Connection's Travel Trainer, Devon, worked with Renee to identify and practice the most accessible route to her dragon boat practice. They worked on street crossing skills, using the transit app to plan trips and check when buses will arrive as well as navigating the Hawthorne Bride and Eastside Esplanade safely until she was ready to make the trip independently.

While the sport is still somewhat new for her, Renee likes that her body and mind must focus and says it's great for her mental health. She has met a lot of good friends through paddling and likes being part of a team. Dragon boating has helped



her to not give up. Being on a team has benefited her in lots of other aspects of her life.

Renee said it is exhilarating to walk across the Hawthorne bridge and know where she is going. She shared that she could not have done this route without Travel Training. Renee has always been active but is able to be even more active now. The help travel training provides her is tremendous and serves as a springboard to make other trips. Renee said, "It is nice to able to travel to dragon boating and be independent."
